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PrEP PROGRAM

CLIENT	SEX			RACE / ETHNICITY				NOTES: PrEP (Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis) is an biomedical HIV prevention strategy for HIV negative people that reduces the risk of contracting the virus. Our PrEP counselor links clients to a PrEP prescribing physician, assists with overcoming financial barriers to obtaining medication, and implements risk reduction techniques to continually work toward behavior modification.

HIV/AIDS TESTING

COMMUNITY	NOTES: Our Outreach Workers performed 147 HIV tests and everyone tested was referred for follow up interventions depending on their individual needs. Through our partnership with the Mecklenburg County Health Department, we provided office space for them to perform HIV/STI tests for an additional 140 people. This partnership allows easy access for people working in the uptown area as well as the community's homeless population.
